

Israel Tactical: Authorities on December 14 warns of increased passenger traffic at Ben Gurion International Airport during Hanukkah holidays; allot for disruptions

Current Situation:

- The Israel Airports Authority (IAA) has announced that passenger traffic at Ben Gurion International Airport (TLV) is expected to increase during the ongoing Hanukkah holiday.
- It stated that with the start of the Hanukkah vacation, a sharp increase in passenger volumes is already being observed at TLV, with peak passenger traffic anticipated on **December 18, 21, and 22**, when approximately 65,000 passengers are expected to transit through the airport each day.
- Overall, the IAA projects that around 508,000 passengers will travel through TLV on international flights during the Hanukkah holiday period.
